Under The Federal Transparency In Coverage Rule

Under the Transparency in Coverage Rule, issued in 2020 by the U. S. Department of Health & Human Services, U. S. Department of Labor and U. S. Department of the Treasury, and enforced beginning 7/1/2022, companies who sponsor employee health plans must publish two separate machine readable files that provide specific details regarding their health plans. The two files are:

- 1) <u>In Network</u>: Negotiated rates for all covered items and services between the plan or issuer and in-network providers; and
- 2) <u>Out of Network</u>: Allowed amount paid to, and billed charges from, out-of-network providers for all covered services within a 90-day period.

In order to meet regulatory requirements, Cigna has provided "K" Line America, Inc., with the link below. The machine readable files are formatted to allow researchers, regulators, and application developers to more easily access and analyze data.
